On Sunday 1st of November prayers will be said in

It is stated in the Second Book of Maccabees: "It is a holy and a wholesome thought to pray for the dead that they may be loosed from their sins" and so we have Masses offered for our dead, we visit the cemeteries and we gain indulgences for the souls of the faithful departed.

What are Indulgences?

They are the remission before God of the temporal punishment due to sins whose guilt has already been forgiven. The faithful Christian who is duly disposed gains the indulgence under prescribed conditions for either oneself or the departed.

All Souls Indulgence.

From noon on 1st November until midnight 2nd November, all who have confessed, received Holy Communion, (within a week) and prayed for the Pope's intentions (one Our Father and Hail Mary, or any other prayer of one's choice) can gain one plenary indulgence by visiting a church and there reciting one Our Father and the Apostles Creed.

Secondly, those who visit a cemetery and pray for the dead may gain a plenary indulgence, applicable only to the Holy Souls on the usual conditions, once a day from the 1st to the 8th of November.

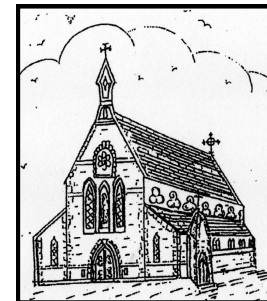

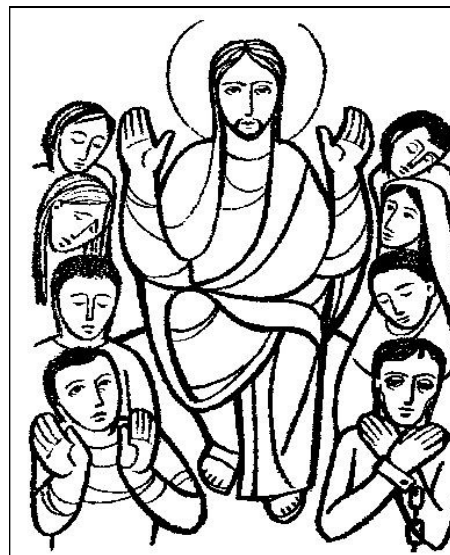
First Reading: Apoc. 7: 2-4, 9-14.

Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels

Christ begins his sermon with blessings, for he came into the world to bless us (Acts iii. 26), as the great High Priest of our profession; as the blessed Melchizedec; as He in whom all the families of the earth should be blessed, Gen. xii. 3. He came not only to purchase blessings

for us, but to pour out and pronounce blessings on us; and here he does it as one having authority, as one that can command the blessing, even life for evermore, and that is the blessing here again and again promised to the good; his pronouncing them happy makes them so; for those whom he blesses, are blessed indeed. The Old Testament ended with a curse (Mal. iv. 6), the gospel begins with a blessing; for hereunto are we called, that we should inherit the blessing. Each of the blessings Christ here pronounces has a double intention: 1. To show who they are that are to be accounted truly happy, and what their characters are. 2. What that is wherein true happiness consists, in the promises made to persons of certain characters, the performance of which will make them happy. Now,

All Saints' Day

All Saints' Day is a solemn holy day of the
Catholic Church celebrated annually on
November 1. The day is dedicated to the saints
of the Church, that is, all those who have at-
tained heaven. It should not be confused with
All Souls' Day, which is observed on Novem-
ber 2, and is dedicated to those who have died
and not yet reached heaven.

Although millions of people may already be
saints, All Saints' Day observances tend to
focus on known saints --that is those recog-
nized in the canon of the saints by the Catholic
Church.

Today, All Saints' Day is still a holy day of
obligation, but only when it falls on a Sunday.
Other countries have different rules according
to their national bishop's conferences. The
bishops of each conference have the authority
to amend the rules surrounding the obligation
of the day.

All Saints' Day was formally started by Pope
Boniface IV, who consecrated the Parthenon at
Rome to the Virgin Mary and all the Martyrs
on May 13 in 609 AD. Boniface IV also estab-
lished All Souls' Day, which follows All Saints.
The holy day was eventually established on
November 1 by Pope Gregory III in the mid-
eighth century as a day dedicated to the saints
and their relics. The May 13 celebration was
subsequently abandoned.
