Pope Francis wants a 'spiritual mobilisation' against terror, according to one of his most senior advisers.

In the wake of the Islamist terrorist attacks on Paris at the weekend, the Pontiff sees the 'Year of Mercy' as an even more vital part of the Church's outreach.

According to Cardinal Pietro Parolin, the Pope's chief diplomat, Francis believes that "in this world torn by violence, now is the right time to launch an offensive of mercy."

Taking Pope Francis to the classroom.

A number of students from one of Ireland's leading teacher training colleges have taken a unique approach to teaching children about the environment.

Papal documents aren't usually the top choice resource for teachers, especially at primary school level, but Pope Francis' recent encyclical on the environment has proven to be accessible for all ages.

That's what a group of student teachers from Limerick's Mary Immaculate College found when they took on the challenge of explaining Laudato Si' to a class of 12-year-olds at Corbally's Scoil Íde. Third year student teacher David Walsh told The Irish Catholic he "thoroughly enjoyed" the experience and would "absolutely" consider using other Church documents in classes in the future as a result.

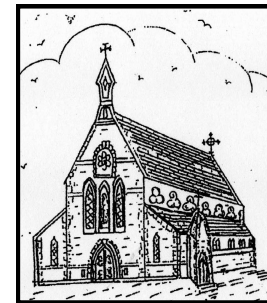
Feast of St. Andrew.

Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels

The Feast of Christ the King is the final Sunday in the liturgical calendar. In the Gospel today, Pilate is concerned with what type of King Jesus is and what kind of Kingdom he is talking about? To understand what type of kingship Jesus is talking about we need to lay aside a lot of

the cultural baggage that we have about Kings and Kingdoms. There are no palaces, no pomp and ceremony involved here. Jesus' Kingdom is concerned with justice for the weak and the oppressed.

At our baptism we were each anointed as 'priest, prophet and king' and therefore we share in this kingship that Pilate is wondering about. We are called to show the world that Jesus's followers are concerned with love and service of others; that Jesus' Kingdom is built on a different kind of foundation. With so much brokenness in the world we are called to transformative service. There is no shortage of causes: the refugee crisis; homelessness; climate justice...

At the end of this month, world leaders gather in Paris at 'COP21' to try to come to a universal agreement on addressing climate change. We pray that the 'Kings' and 'Presidents' of this world take strong action to protect our planet. 'We pray for the representatives of the nations meeting in Paris, and in every government everywhere - and all business leaders and consumers - that we will see nature as a magnificent book in which God speaks to us and grants us a glimpse of his infinite beauty and goodness. Carrigtwohill Historical Society Lecture.

Frances Taylor from Lincolnshire in Eng-
land, was the daughter of a Minister of the
Anglican Church. Though from relatively
comfortable childhood, she volunteered to
nurse in Turkey during the Crimean War,
and in 1872, she founded the Catholic
order of nuns, the "Poor Servants of the
Mother of God". At 7.30 PM on Friday
27th November, **Sr. Elizabeth Sheehan**
will tell the story of this woman, and how
her life led her to set up a convent in
Carrigtwohill in 1875. This lecture forms
part of the Winter/Spring program of the
Carrigtwohill and District Historical Soci-
ety, and will be held in the Student Hall, of
the St. Aloysius Secondary School (off
Main Street) Carrigtwohill. All welcome.
