Towards Peace is a new spiritual support service designed for those who have experienced sexual, physical, emotional or spiritual abuse by Catholic Church personnel in Ireland. Support is also available for family members of abuse survivors. The vision of Towards Peace is to provide a safe supportive space, where people who have been affected by abuse in a Church context can be accompanied as they seek their own experience of spiritual peace, one step at a time. Towards Peace provides spiritual support through one-to-one spiritual direction sessions, with a qualified spiritual companion. Up to nine sessions are offered and there is no cost. Accord 2014 work returns

“Accord Marriage Care 2014 work returns show that we met with just over 60,000 men, women and children, face-to-face, across the island. This is an extraordinary figure and demonstrates the relevance and value of Accord for our society today, as well as the high esteem and trust in which we are held by the Irish people. This 60,000 figure breaks down as: 15,504 persons in marriage preparation courses; 9,233 clients availing of 46,656 marriage counselling hours (38,880 sessions); while 35,997 people attended our schools’ programme. I am also glad to report that Accord’s counselling service benefited 6,300 families, including 13,832 children up to the age of eighteen years old.”

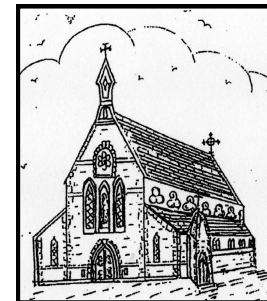

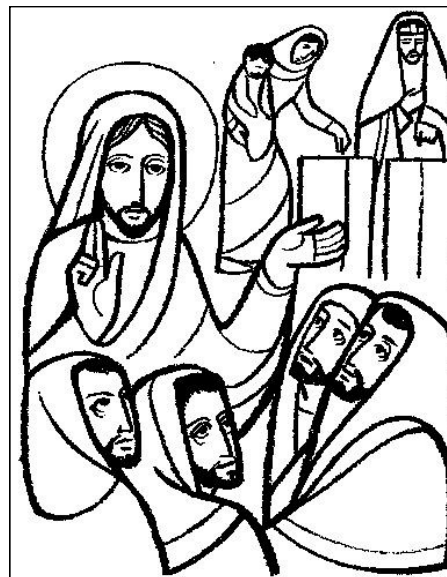

Seeing your life through the lens of the gospels

The widow tossed the only shred of independence she had in to the offering plate, but she kept intact her complete dependence on God and neighbor. She is our spiritual mentor standing there on the margins of all we hold dear.

Her way is a life of faith grounded in the love of God, the grace of our Lord Jesus Christ and the communion of the Holy Spirit. It's a life lived in the conviction that we are stewards of all we have in our hands and our lives, not the owners of these things.

Where previously we connected dependence with oppression and depression, Jesus shows us that our dependence on God leads to joy and thanksgiving. If God is running the universe and ruling my life, I no longer have to save myself, prove myself or justify myself. I'm the work of God's hands. I rest and work in those hands and I shall die in those hands. To be free of those hands would be death to me, because in them is life abundant. We give thanks for the widow's great witness. May we be as free as she is.

The Jubilee of Mercy

The Jubilee Year of Mercy (8 December
2015 - 20 November 2016) is an oppor-
tunity to remind ourselves that mercy and
compassion are at the heart of the mission
of Jesus in the world today. We can be
'missionaries of mercy' in our everyday
lives by the way that we live and interact
with others. On the 3rd Sunday of Advent -
13 December - The Holy Door in St. Pe-
ter's Basilica will be opened by Pope
Francis. Symbolic 'Holy Doors' will be
also be opened in cathedrals throughout
the world inviting people to make a pil-
grimage of mercy as they cross the thresh-
old of compassion. At a local level this
journey of compassion can be replicated
and celebrated in a variety of ways. Our
starting point is the challenge of Jesus in
Luke 3:36 - *Merciful Like The Father* -
which is the motto of the Jubilee Year and
the document of Pope Francis -
Misericordiae Vultus - the Face of Mercy.
The motto 'serves as an invitation to fol-
low the merciful example of the Father
who asks us not to judge or condemn but
to forgive and to give love and forgiveness
without measure cfr. Lk 6:37-
