Celebrating Safely in Covid -19 Times

Please abide by these guidelines to ensure respect for one another as we emerge from Covid -19 restrictions slowly.

- *The capacity of the Church is 70 to 80 people (depends on family units sitting together) at this time due to having two sections that are 4 metres apart.*
- *Enter by the main door and use all doors to exit, side aisles exit by side doors, centre aisle exit by main door, beginning with seats nearest the door.*
- *Sanitise hands on entry and exit to the Church.*
- *Sanitise your seat with sanitising wipes available before and after use.*
- *Household units may sit on the same seat in the middle aisles.*
- *Couples and individuals may sit on the side aisles seats nearest the aisle and not next to the radiators.*
- *A face covering /mask must be worn, respect others around you.*
- *Do not gather in Church grounds before or after Mass.*
- *Holy Communion will be brought to people.*
- *If one wishes to receive Holy Communion, stand and receive on your hands.*
- *If a person is feeling unwell, please stay at home until you feel better.*
- *Cough, sneeze into your elbow or tissue.*
- *Do not touch unnecessary surfaces.*

Postures during Mass

- *Stand for the entrance to end of Opening Prayer.*
- *Sit for readings. Stand for Gospel. Sit for Homily.*
- *Stand for Creed and Intercessions*
- *Stand for Eucharistic Prayer when the priest says “pray brothers and sisters that my sacrifice and yours” until the Lamb of God.*
- *Stand to receive Holy Communion.*
- *Stand for Concluding Prayer and blessing.*
- *Singing will be led by Cantor(s) or priest. The congregation is asked not to join vocally in this at the present time but to sing in your hearts and minds.*

The Government has announced the easing of some restrictions for Churches, however the detail of what it means for churches to be able to have 50% of their capacity is still awaited. For example if social distancing is still required for the 2metre rule, then the capacity of the Church will not increase much.

Celebrating the Sacraments of Confirmation and receiving Holy Communion for the first time. As the Government has announced that the celebration of these Sacraments can resume from the 20th of September, plans will be put in place in the coming week to make arrangements. The first priority will be to celebrate the reception of Holy Communion for the first time with those who have been waiting since 2020.

Bishop William Crean announces clerical changes and pastoral plans in the Diocese of Cloyne.

Each passing year changes our circumstances in the Diocese. Over these past number of years, we have had to review and readjust the manner in which our priests can serve all the parishes. This has involved some parishes not having a priest in residence as we have been accustomed to. This readjustment is difficult to embrace but we need to do so in a spirit of generosity and co-operation. In this refiguration process three parishes will be affected this year; Churchtown-Liscarroll, Ballyclough-Kilbrin and Buttevant-Lisgriffin. Instead of three priests heretofore, now, two priests will share the pastoral care of the three parishes. I am grateful to Fr. Eugene Baker and Fr. Mícheál Leader for their willingness and generosity in embracing this new challenge as Fr. Robin Morrissey takes on the pastoral care of Castletownroche and Ballyhooly. I am indebted to the priests who have, in a spirit of priestly service and humility, accepted their new assignments in the vineyard of the Lord. I welcome our new permanent deacon, Leonard Cleary, who will serve alongside the priests of Charleville parish.

Synodality

This is a word we will become more familiar with as we engage with the Synodal Pathway called for by Pope Francis. This process will be directed in the Diocese by a small steering group co-ordinated by Fr. Jim Moore (Co-ordinator of Mission and Ministry). The group includes Ms. Jennifer Buckley, Cobh, Martha Kent, Mitchelstown, and Brian Williams (deacon), Macroom.

Lector and Acolyte

Recently Pope Francis announced the formal establishment of the offices of Lector and Acolyte for women and men. This is a grace-filled opportunity for the Diocese to offer formation and training for those who feel called to this service in the Church. We will embrace this initiative to make it a reality as part of supporting faith and practice in families and parishes.
