The Holy Trinity

" Today we are celebrating the Most Holy Trinity. The Trinity is not a theological riddle, but rather the splendid mystery of God's closeness. The Trinity tells us that we do not have a solitary God above in heaven, distant and indifferent; no, he is Father who gave us his Son, who became man like us, and who, in order to be even closer to us, to help us bear the burdens of life, sends us his very Spirit. He, who is Spirit, enters our spirit and thus comforts us from within, bringing God's tenderness into our heart. With God the burdens of life do not rest on our shoulders: the Spirit, whom we name each time we make the sign of the Cross precisely as we touch our shoulders, comes to give us strength, to encourage us, to bear the burdens. Indeed, he is an expert in resuscitation, in raising up again, in rebuilding. It takes more strength to repair than to build, to recommence than to start from scratch, to reconcile than to just get along. This is the strength that God gives us. Therefore those who draw near to God do not lose heart, but go forward: they recommence, try again, rebuild. They also suffer, but manage to start over, to try again, to rebuild.! ". Caring for retired priests in Cloyne Diocese

The annual collection for retired priests will take place at all Masses on the weekend of June 18th /19th . The retirement age for priests of this diocese is 75. Funds to support caring for retired priests are raised in three ways:

- ◆ Finance is invested so that the interest can be used. Unfortunately, the return on this investment has declined seriously over the past number of years and looks likely to remain low for the foreseeable future.
- ◆ Parishes give 7.5% of the door collection.
- ◆ Working priests give an annual contribution.
- Special Collection throughout the Diocese on a Sunday in the year.

On the 24th June Evening Prayer will be celebrated as a Liturgy of thanksgiving for the ministry of priests, religious and deacons who served in the Parish. This is the Feast of the Sacred Heart of Jesus and world day of prayer for priests. This will be at 7.30pm and all are invited. We welcome back priests who served in the Parish over the years and Religious Sisters living in the parish.

The 24th of June is also the world day of prayer for priests. Please remember priests in your prayers this day and pray also for vocations to the Priesthood.

In 2017 there were 78 priests in active ministry in the Diocese of Cloyne, at this present time 2022 there are 65. In 2017 there was a resident priest in each of the 46 parishes. Today in 2022 there are 5 parishes without a resident priest. Due to the shortage of priests the Diocese is reflecting on how to serve the communities into the future with less priests available.

Synodal Process

Review of Safeguarding Children Policy and Procedures in the Diocese of Cloyne

A review into the Safeguarding Children practices and procedures will take place in the Diocese of Cloyne on the last week of June. Bishop Crean has invited the National Board for Safeguarding Children in Ireland to undertake this Review. Two reviewers will be visiting the Diocese to audit how the Diocese has implemented the Policy for Safeguarding Children in the Diocese.
