

Pope Francis Message for Mission Sunday 23rd October 2022

“*You shall be my witnesses*” –

Each baptized person is called to mission, in the Church and by the mandate of the Church: consequently, mission is carried out together, not individually, in communion with the ecclesial community, and not on one’s own initiative. Even in cases where an individual in some very particular situation carries out the evangelizing mission alone, he must always do so in communion with the Church which commissioned him.. As Saint Paul VI taught in the Apostolic Exhortation *Evangelii Nuntiandi*: “Evangelization is for no one an individual and isolated act; it is one that is deeply ecclesial.” the disciples are urged to live their personal lives in a missionary key: they are sent by Jesus to the world not only to carry out, but also and above all to live the mission entrusted to them; not only to bear witness, but also and above all to be witnesses of Christ.”

It celebrates the courage and determination of those who are challenging the activities of large corporations, whose activities damage the environment and violate human rights.

Famine in Somalia: Currently in Somalia more than seven million people, or 45% of the population, are not getting enough food, the highest level of food insecurity ever recorded in the East African country. Aid agencies estimate that 1.5 million children are severely malnourished, and UN forecasting suggests that as many as 350,000 children could already have died this year. Across the wider Horn of Africa, one person is likely dying every 48 seconds from hunger.
