Jesus entered Jericho and was going through the town when a man whose name was Zacchaeus made his appearance: he was one of the senior tax collectors and a wealthy man. He was anxious to see what kind of man Jesus was, but he was too short and could not see him for the crowd. So he ran ahead and climbed a sycamore tree to catch a glimpse of Jesus who was to pass that way. When Jesus reached the spot he looked up and spoke to him: ‘Zacchaeus,

“Special issues need to be taken into account.

Place for musicians: The choir and other music ministers should be provided with a space that is integrated within the assembly and that allows ample room for instruments so they can truly lead the people in song.¹⁸ It is important that each musician be able to participate fully in the celebration of the Eucharist.

The human voice: The human voice should always hold a primary place in the music-making of the Church. For this reason, recorded music must never replace the singing of the assembly, nor should it displace the ministry of other musicians. (33)” Catholic Bishops –Canada – Liturgical Music
