Matthew 5:38-48

Jesus said to his disciples: ‘You have learnt how it was said: Eye for eye and tooth for tooth. But I say this to you: offer the wicked man no resistance. On the contrary, if anyone hits you on the right cheek, offer him the other as well; if a man takes you to law and would have your tunic, let him have your cloak as well. And if anyone orders you to go one mile, go two miles with him. Give to anyone who asks, and if anyone wants to borrow, do not turn away.

‘You have learnt how it was said: You must love your neighbour and hate your enemy. But I say this to you: love your enemies and pray for those who persecute you; in this way you will be sons of your Father in heaven, for he causes his sun to rise on bad men as well as good, and his rain to fall on honest and dishonest men alike. For if you love those who love you, what right have you to claim any credit? Even the tax collectors do as much, do they not? And if you save your greetings for your brothers, are you doing anything exceptional? Even the pagans do as much, do they not? You must therefore be perfect just as your heavenly Father is perfect.’

Lent: a time of fast and abstinence

Lent is the traditional season of renewal and penance in the Church.

Ash Wednesday: February 18th

Ashes will be blessed and given during 10am and 7.30pm Masses:

The external practices of religion have their meaning and are acceptable in the sight of God only if they proceed from the heart and mind. Taking Ashes on our forehead is a mark or sign that we shall 'turn away from sin and be faithful to the Gospel'. If that conviction is lacking the action is worthless.

Ash Wednesday is a Day of Fast and Abstinence.

Fasting means that the amount of food we eat is considerably reduced.

Abstinence means that we give up a particular kind of food or drink or form of amusement. Meat is given up on Ash Wednesday and Fridays of Lent in honour of the Passion of the Lord Jesus. All persons who have completed their fourteenth year are bound by the law of abstinence; all adults are bound by the law of fast up to the beginning of their sixtieth year.

Lent is What You Do ————— What will you do?

It is the forty days of preparation for the celebration of Christ's saving death and resurrection at Easter. It is a time of purification when Christians renew and fulfil their baptismal promises, by dying to selfishness and living for Christ. We do this by being committed to Prayer, Fasting, and Almsgiving during Lent.

Make a Lenten Commitment

A Lenten Commitment may mean taking on one of the following:

- Make a personal pledge to pray each day.
 - Celebrate daily Mass more frequently
 - Adoration of the Blessed Sacrament, Mondays 10.30 -6
 - Lenten Prayer every Sunday of Lent at 5.30pm
 - Pray the Stations of the Cross each week
 - Join the community for Taize Prayer on Fridays of Lent at 7pm leading into Mass at 7.30pm
 - Take part in the Lenten series of Talks
 - Fast and abstain from meat on Fridays of lent.
 - Support the Trócaire Campaign
 - Read the Passion of Jesus from the Gospel of Matthew, write it out in one's own handwriting. Matthew chapters 26, 27, 28.
 - Give up alcohol for Lent, take the temperance pledge
 - visit the sick, help someone in need.
